Sometimes referred to as “the instrument of the sages,” the gu qin was one of the Four Arts that was required of the Chinese scholar gentleman. Embodying the sensibilities and philosophies that governed the Chinese literati for hundreds and even thousands of years, the gu qin thus combines both spirituality and musicality in its aesthetics, and is inseparable from Chinese intellectual history. It was inscribed in 2008 on the Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity (UNESCO).

Dr Tong Kin-Woon (PhD., Wesleyan University, 1983) is a renowned ethnomusicologist and scholar of the gu qin.
